Dr. Janice Dvorkin is the Coordinator of the Music Therapy Program at the University of the Incarnate Word in San Antonio, Texas. She also has a part-time psychological and music psychotherapy practice. She is a licensed Psychologist in Texas and New York State. Dr. Dvorkin has been practicing as a Music Therapist for 27 years and as a Psychologist for 13 years. She has provided clinical supervision to music therapists and other mental health professionals for 17 years. She has presented her work nationally and internationally. Her areas of interest are the use of object relations theory in music therapy in treatment with Borderline Personality Disordered individuals, music therapy supervision and the emotional development of children with Autism Spectrum Disorder and Williams Syndrome. She has published this work in music therapy journals and books.
